River City OMS Dental Implant Warranty

- 1. River City OMS (RCOMS) will warranty dental implants we place in **Normal Risk Patients (see below)** for 5 years so long as: **a)** the patient is compliant with regular maintenance meaning there are records of the patient keeping the appointments recommended by the restorative dentist and having recommended maintenance therapy(s), **b)** the tooth/teeth for the implant(s) was made by an experienced Texas licensed restorative dentist RCOMS agreed to work with, and **c)** RCOMS is still in business. If a patient experiences a biologic or mechanical failure leading to the complete loss of the implant within 5 years of placing the implant and meet the 3 requirements above, we will replace the implant one time at no charge using the same type of anesthesia used to originally place the implant.
- 2. If an implant is placed under warranty, there will be a charge for necessary additional parts and pieces such as cover screws or abutments. There will be a charge for necessary bone or gum grafts.
- 3. If a replacement implant fails there will be a charge to replace the replacement implant. There is no warranty on the replacement implant.
- 4. This warranty does not apply to the prosthetic tooth or teeth on the implant. The restorative doctor who made the tooth/teeth may or may not warranty the teeth.
- 5. A **Normal Risk Patient** is a patient who does NOT have or participate in one or more of the following:
 - A. Previous biologic failure of any implant in the body, including dental implants
 - B. Smoking you must stop smoking 3 months before implant surgery and continue to not smoke in order to be considered a Normal Risk Patient
 - C. Diabetes diabetic patients must show an average hemoglobin A1c of 8.0 or less from the time of implant placement in order to be considered a Normal Risk Patient.
 - D. Vascular disease patients with blockages in the arteries are more likely to have healing problems.
 - E. Immunosuppression immunosuppressed patients include but are not limited to: transplant patients, patients with autoimmune conditions, liver or kidney failure patients, cancer patients, or HIV/AIDS patients.
 - F. Chronic steroid use
 - G. **Penicillin/amoxicillin allergy** there are articles in the scientific literature that have studied thousands of implants and found a three times higher implant failure rate in penicillin allergic patients. No one understands why this happens but it is a known and developing concern.
 - H. Radiation therapy to the head, neck, or face no matter how long ago.
 - I. Use of bisphosphonate drugs and other drugs that affect bone metabolism such as:
 - Boniva
 - Fosamax
 - Actonel
 - Aredia

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If a warrantied implant fails, you must notify RCOMS as soon as possible.

If a warrantied implant fails and you decline to have the implant replaced for any reason, RCOMS will refund the cost of the dental implant minus \$300. There is no refund of bone graft fees or any other fees, only the cost of the dental implant minus \$300.
